OVERVIEW OF SERVICES

Child abuse treatment and prevention through the provision of individual, group and family counseling for the following:

- Survivors of child sexual, physical and emotional abuse
- Adult survivors of childhood sexual abuse
- Adult and child sexual abuse offenders
- Children and adolescents with sexually acting out behaviors

Psychiatric evaluation and follow-up available for child clients.



The program is contracted by the Division of Youth and Family Services to provide mental health treatment to victims of child abuse and their families.

The program maintains a strong affiliation with the Monmouth County Prosecutor's Office and Child Advocacy Center. In addition to the provision of treatment, clinicians perform the following functions:

- Member of Child Advocacy Center Advisory Board
- Founding member of Multi-Disciplinary Team
- Child Victim/Witness Advocate for Grand Jury

The program has extensive experience in treatment of adult perpetrators and works closely with County Probation and Parole Boards. Clinicians are members of the Association for Treatment of Sexual Abusers (ATSA).
