**COURSE DESCRIPTIONS:**

**Food Safety:** *This course examines the changing nature of foodborne outbreaks and the changing nature of outbreak epidemiology. This includes a look at the shifting scope of food distribution, the scope of outbreak occurrence, and changes in the scale of contamination.*

**The Management of Epidemic Disease:** *Program faculty will examine disease as a social event in an evolving global community and discuss why applying new systems and science is critical for tomorrow's public health professional.*

**CPR-AED for Healthcare Providers:** *This course teaches CPR and relief of choking in adults and children, infant CPR and relief of choking, and use of barrier devices for all ages. CPR is taught for those who have a duty to respond to a cardiac emergency because of job responsibilities or regulatory requirements.*

**WMD: Advanced Tactical Operations: Safe & Effective Response to Terrorism Incidents:** *This course demonstrates how, in a terrorist incident, tactical commanders, operators and support personnel are provided with knowledge, skills, and abilities to command, plan, equip, train and exercise tactical teams for safe and effective response to such incidents.*

**Building Healthy Communities through Universal Design:** *Course description will be added.*

**The Need for Adult Immunization:** *This course provides a rationale for adult immunization, and focuses on vaccines specifically aimed at preventing pneumococcal pneumonia, herpes zoster (shingles), and Hepatitis B.*

**Family Disaster Planning:** *This course covers essential actions that all individuals should take in case of an emergency, and how to prepare an emergency supplies kit. Special planning issues—assisting families with young children, special needs family members and pets will be covered.*

**Psychological First Aid:** *This course will teach first responders and volunteers techniques to offer comfort and practical assistance and to reduce the initial distress of children, adults, and other first responders who have been exposed to disasters or terrorism. Students will also have a chance to practice each of the core components of psychological first aid.*

**Outbreak Investigation Part II:** *This course is a table-top exercise. The objectives of the course are to describe the goals of a Public Health investigation and to understand the role of the MRC in a Communicable Disease Investigation.*
