

Vessel Sewage

Attention Boaters: The Navesink and Shrewsbury Rivers are NO DISCHARGE ZONES

State law prohibits the discharge of sewage, treated or untreated, in designated No Discharge Zones. When boating within the state's No Discharge Zones, all pathways for discharge of treated or untreated sewage must be secured. Under the Clean Water Act illegal discharge of sewage from a vessel subjects the vessel owner or operator to civil penalty of up to \$2,000 for each violation under section 1322(j) of the Act. In addition, the Shark River, Manasquan River and Barnegat Bay (southern entrance to the Point Pleasant Canal south to Beach Haven Inlet) are No Discharge Zones.


