COURSE DESCRIPTIONS:

Immunization Update 2009: Up-to-date information will be provided on the rapidly changing field of immunization. Anticipated topics include influenza (including H1N1 influenza), rotavirus, vaccine safety and vaccine supply. So called “alternative” vaccine schedules and other emerging vaccine issues will also be discussed.

Administrative Support for PODs: This class describes the process for preparing for flu clinics, including necessary paperwork and client flow-through.

Phone Bank with Interpersonal and Tactical Communication: This class will discuss how we establish a phone bank to handle calls during emergencies. We will also be discussing interpersonal communications (the communication that occurs between people) as well as tactical communication (how to use the various forms of communication equipment).

Cultural Competence: The concept of cultural competence is explored. Five dimensions of human activity, crucial to understanding cultural differences will be described. Cultural barriers to obtaining health care will be examined. Methods for maintaining a therapeutic alliance with individuals will be described, despite differences in culture.

Conflict Management: Developing Strategies for Effective Communication: This program examines how human feelings affect working relationships with others and describes effective communication techniques.

Influenza: Facing New Global Challenges: This program defines the difference between seasonal, avian, and pandemic flu and describes treatment for each. Additional information will be provided on the H1N1 virus.

H1N1 Train-the-Trainer for Health Education Ambassadors: This class is for MRC Health Education Ambassador members, prepares them to present training on the topic of h1N1 influenza to community groups, and provides appropriate training materials to them.

Immunization Update: This program will provide up-to-date information on the rapidly changing field of immunization. Anticipated topics include influenza (including H1N1 influenza), rotavirus, vaccine safety and vaccine supply.

MRC Orientation: This class will introduce volunteers to our mission and goals and provide an overview of training you will need to deploy.

Surge Vaccinator Training: This class provides education and training regarding mass prophylaxis of vaccine during a governor-declared state of emergency.

How to Run a Large Scale Vaccination Clinic: This class will describe the methodology for setting up a public distribution site for vaccinations.

September 1 09 Training Schedule

Human Papilloma Virus and the HPV Vaccine: Provides public health nurses and other health professionals with a basic orientation to HPV, the HPV vaccine, and methods of how to present this information to the community.

CBRNE: This program addresses chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear, and explosive hazards.
