PRESENTATION:

Andrew J. Spears, Assistant Director, presented to the Board the background with regard to the Hartshorne Woods Park Master Plan.

Gail L. Hunton, Supervising Historic Preservation Specialist, introduced Joseph V. Sardonia, LLA, Supervising Landscape Architect, Ken Thoman, Senior County Park Manager, and Andrew R. Coeyman, Supervisor/Land Preservation Office.

Gail L. Hunton, Supervising Historic Preservation Specialist, presented an overview of the Hartshorne Woods Park Master Plan.

Joseph V. Sardonia, LLA, Supervising Landscape Architect, reviewed with the Board proposed improvements at Claypit Creek Area of Hartshorne Woods Park. Mr. Sardonia noted the freshwater pond spillway, boardwalk "magic carpet", and addressed questions from Acting Chairman Harmon, Commissioners Horsnall and Butch.

Acting Chairman Harmon and members of the Board thanked Gail Hunton and Joe Sardonia for their informative presentation.

On a motion made by Commissioner Horsnall, seconded by Commissioner Adcock, the meeting was **OPENED** to the **HEARING OF THE PUBLIC** at 7:54 PM. Upon being put to a vote, the motion was unanimously carried.

Mr. Dave Ackerman, of Highlands, NJ, addressed the Board with regard to the prohibition of a recreation activity, skateboarding use by youth, at Hartshorne Woods.

Following Mr. Ackerman's comments, Acting Chairman Harmon noted that the Board will look into his concerns.

Mrs. Judy Hands, of Middletown, NJ, indicated that she is a Senior Hiker, and asked that Park System trail signage be improved in all the parks and presented a petition to Acting Chairman Harmon.

Mr. Mike Kravis, of Shrewsbury, NJ, indicated that he is a Senior Hike, and noted that trail markings are needed as there are too many unmarked trails. Mr. Kravis also noted that the Park System is one of the few that don't mark the trails very well.

Mr. John Giordano, of Middletown, NJ, indicated that the Monmouth County Park System has the poorest marked trails.

Ms. Peggy Noecker, of Red Bank, NJ, indicated that she wants to use the trails without getting lost.

Mr. James Schmitt, of Red Bank, NJ, indicated that he didn't understand why the trails are not adequately marked.

Ms. Bonnie Gold, of Long Branch, NJ, addressed the need for markers on the trails and the issue of rouge trails, and offered to volunteer to do the trails' markings.

Mr. Darrin Montague, of Locust, NJ, inquired as to the length of the proposed kayak launch and the location of the boardwalk and deck area. Mr. Montague noted that he felt the proposed deck area is excessive and too costly.

Ms. Kate Ketchem, of Locust, NJ, commented on the kayak launch area and the fact that use will be limited to approximately half a day. Ms. Ketchem also noted the location of the shelter and the view from across the opposite shore.

Gail L. Hunton, Supervising Historic Preservation Specialist, noted that the shelter is sited where the house was formally located.

Joseph V. Sardonia, LLA, Supervising Landscape Architect, reviewed how the shelter would be used by the public.

Ms. Kate Ketchem noted that the stairway near the freshwater pond may have an impact on the wildlife.

Joseph V. Sardonia noted the location of the stairways and the removal of the existing stairs.

Mr. John Giordano inquired as to the need for improvements at the Claypit Creek Area.

Gail L. Hunton explained the basis of the County Open Space Plan and addressing needs including the public's access to waterfronts.

Mr. Ken Thoman, Senior County Park Manager, reviewed the origin of the Park System trails development plan.

There being no one else present who wished to be heard, it was moved by Commissioner Hennessy, seconded by Commissioner Adcock, that the portion of the meeting **OPEN** to the **HEARING OF THE PUBLIC** be **CLOSED**, at 8:40 PM.

Freeholder Lillian G. Burry noted she ceded her time.

At 8:42 PM, Acting Chairman Harmon declared a three (3) minute recess.

Members of the public left the meeting including Joseph V. Sardonia, Anne Simon and Ken Thoman.

At 8:46 PM, Acting Chairman Harmon called the meeting back into session.
