A Poster Contest for Fourth Graders

All Monmouth County fourth graders are invited to design a poster for entry in the contest. The rules are set forth below.

- THE POSTER MUST BE ON STANDARD 22" X 28" POSTER BOARD
- THE NAME OF MONMOUTH COUNTY MUST BE IN 4-INCH LETTERS FORMED IN BLACK MARKER AT THE TOP OF THE POSTER
- THE STUDENT'S NAME, TEACHER'S NAME AND SCHOOL MUST BE PRINTED NEATLY IN THE LOWER RIGHT HAND CORNER ON THE BACK OF THE POSTER

Design and content of the poster are at the student's discretion. Special knowledge or background is not needed. A general guideline would be to depict something which makes Monmouth County unique.

First, second and third place winners will be selected. They will receive a prize and be invited to the Surrogate's Office in Freehold for a photo session with the Surrogate, Sheriff and County Clerk.

All posters become the property of the Constitutional Officers Association and the County of Monmouth; selected posters may appear on a published calendar. Submission of the posters grants the Constitutional Officers Association permission to display the posters in public places.
