2. Golf Report

Mike Janoski, County Park Superintendent/Golf Operations, updated the Board with regard to Golf Operations.

Mr. Janoski reported that the Howell Park Golf Course Fairway Bunker Renovation Project was complete in the middle of August, about 2 weeks ahead of schedule. The project was very well executed and the finished product has been getting favorable reviews.

Mr. Janoski also reported that Bel-Aire Golf Course hosted 47 junior golfers on August 16th, for the Annual Youth Tournament.

Mr. Janoski informed the Board that Golf Courses were performing fall aeration of all courses and were around 40% - 50% complete.

Mr. Janoski reviewed with the Board August rounds of golf as compared to 2016 and noted that rounds were down slightly at 573 rounds which was attributed to the improvement project at Howell Park.

Mr. Janoski also reviewed with the Board year-to-date rounds as compared to 2016 and noted that we were basically flat at 153,638 (2017) vs. 154,469 (2016). Despite rounds being down slightly, revenues are actually up 2.1% at \$7,361,182 through August 31st.

Mr. Janoski reported to the Board that the Ladies scramble and the Senior Championship were two new tournaments scheduled in the next month.

3. Parks Report

Tom Fobes, Superintendent of County Parks/Park Operations, updated the Board with regard to park operations for the month of August through September, to date.

Mr. Fobes reported that the 2017 park attendance, to date, reflects a successful summer throughout the Monmouth County Park System. Visitors are visiting our parks and taking advantage of all we have to offer. A couple of examples include:

Holmdel Park

- Holmdel Park's attendance during August reflected a slight drop over 2016 August attendance most likely related to weekend weather. Holmdel Park remains one of our most attended parks, recording 77, 619 August visits.
- High School Cross Country practices began in August with approximately 100 schools visiting the park periodically throughout the month.
- Dual and Tri meets are now underway, in two weeks we will host the first of seven larger meets.

Manasquan Reservoir

- The Manasquan Reservoir continues to be our most visited Park in the Monmouth County Park System tallying 147,741 visits in August. This year's August attendance reflects an increase of 9,400 over August of 2016.
- Although boating and fishing is popular, the five mile perimeter trail is the most used aspect of the park.

Hartshorne Woods Park

- Hartshorne Woods Park continues to grow in popularity with 30,073 visits in August.
- Monthly attendance at Hartshorne, beginning in March has averaged 29,500 visits.
- One only needs to visit Rocky Point Parking lot on any given weekend to see the popularity of this growing park area.

Seven Presidents Oceanfront Park

- Although Augusts' weekend weather wasn't always conducive to beach use, Seven Presidents did receive 120,757 visits.
- The Seven Presidents lifeguards reacted to a serious incident appropriately and professionally when an ocean fatality occurred elsewhere, ending on our beach.

Turkey Swamp Park

- Turkey Swamp Park continues to be a well visited park. To date, the park attendance is well ahead of last year's attendance.
- August attendance at Turkey Swamp Park was 32,742.
- Two weekend days during August, boat rentals exceeded 140 the most ever rented on single days.
- Camping remained popular in the family camping area as well as in the group camping area.
- Staff installed a first of a kind in the Monmouth County Park System, a Smokey the Bear sign, near the entrance of Turkey Swamp Park.

Fisherman's Cove Conservation Area

- Sand dredged from the Manasquan Inlet and deposited on Fisherman's Cove beach has been cleaned and raked. A cooperative effort between MCPS staff and Manasquan's DPW was conducted, cleaning debris from the beach.
- Users of all types dog walkers, paddle boarders, fisherman, birdwatchers have all been observed using the Conservation Area.
- Fisherman's Cove Conservation area recorded 9,598 visits during the month of August.

Dorbrook Recreation Area

- To date, Dorbrook Park attendance exceeds 2016 by 36,000 visits, a reflection of a properly functioning sprayground, popular programs, camps and activities.
- During a storm, a large White Pine fell, damaging the sprayground fence and shade structure. Through quick response and action, staff was able to clear the tree from the sprayground, opening later in the day.

Freneau Woods Park

- Staff continues to develop Freneau Woods Park. Volunteer groups have completed several cleanup projects.
- Staff continues to remove remnants of the previous owner, not needed for park use.
- A Deer Management parking lot was completed.
- Staff is preparing to realign the electric and water on desirable buildings while less desirable buildings are prepared for demolition.
- Contractors have been contacted for floor and carpet proposals.

MCPS staff periodically represents the Park System at outside events. Staff participates in parades, competitions and distributes MCPS literature at events – to name a few. This past weekend, MCPS naturalists, public relations personnel, and a park manager participated in the Colliers Mills Wildlife Management Area, NJ Wild Outdoor Expo.

Lastly, today's 9-11 Remembrance Ceremony was a success. Beautiful weather and a well prepared location by staff made for a moving event.

At 7:33 PM, Jeffrey P. Beekman, Special County Counsel, arrived at the meeting.

WHEREAS, the BOARD OF RECREATION COMMISSIONERS adopted RESOLUTION #R-16-2-8=88 recommending to the MONMOUTH COUNTY BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS that an additional \$75,000.00 to the MONMOUTH CONSERVATION FOUNDATION be AUTHORIZED to cover the final phase of the REMEDIAL INVESTIGATION by BRINKERHOFF ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES, INC. and SURVEYING SERVICES by HARRIS SURVEYING, INC., in accordance with the ENVIRONMENTAL INDEMNITY AND ESCROW AGREEMENT and the PROJECT AGREEMENT between the COUNTY OF MONMOUTH and the MONMOUTH CONSERVATION FOUNDATION for SWIMMING RIVER PARK; and

WHEREAS, the BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS adopted RESOLUTION #2016-0281 on March 24, 2016 authorizing an additional \$75,000.00 to the MONMOUTH CONSERVATION FOUNDATION to cover the final phase of the REMEDIAL INVESTIGATION by BRINKERHOFF ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES, INC., and SURVEYING SERVICES by HARRIS SURVEYING, INC., in accordance with the ENVIRONMENTAL INDEMNITY AND ESCROW AGREEMENT and the PROJECT AGREEMENT between the COUNTY OF MONMOUTH and the MONMOUTH CONSERVATION FOUNDATION for SWIMMING RIVER PARK; and

WHEREAS, the MONMOUTH CONSERVATION FOUNDATION successfully negotiated on behalf of the COUNTY OF MONMOUTH the ACQUISITION of the ESTATE OF ANNE DEFILIPPO PROPERTY (CHRIS' DELI), being more particularly described as BLOCK 1098, LOT 126, MIDDLETOWN TOWNSHIP, an improved parcel containing ±1.503 acres, for ADDITIONS TO SWIMMING RIVER PARK; and

WHEREAS, the BOARD OF RECREATION COMMISSIONERS adopted RESOLUTION #R-16-8-22=297 recommending to the MONMOUTH COUNTY BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS the ACQUISITION of the ESTATE OF ANNE DEFILIPPO PROPERTY be authorized; and

WHEREAS, the MONMOUTH COUNTY BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS adopted RESOLUTION #2016-0815 on September 8, 2016 authorizing the ACQUISITION of the ESTATE OF ANNE DEFILIPPO PROPERTY; and

WHEREAS, the MONMOUTH CONSERVATION FOUNDATION commissioned a PRELIMINARY ASSESSMENT/SITE INVESTIGATION of the ESTATE OF ANNE DEFILIPPO PROPERTY on behalf of the COUNTY OF MONMOUTH by BRINKERHOFF ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES, INC., which discovered the potential presence of an underground gasoline storage tank within the right-of-way of West Front Street which has been deemed associated with the property by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection; and

WHEREAS, it is in the interest of the COUNTY OF MONMOUTH to conduct a REMEDIAL INVESTIGATION of the underground gasoline storage tank to determine current status and confirm that there has been no past discharge of product or contamination or the potential for future discharge or contamination and to effect closure of said tank; and

WHEREAS, costs for environmental investigation for public projects may be eligible for grant reimbursement through the NEW JERSEY HAZARDOUS DISCHARGE SITE REMEDIATION FUND (HDSRF); and

WHEREAS, the funds for the REMEDIAL INVESTIGATION are covered under the Monmouth County Open Space, Recreation, Floodplain Protection, Farmland and Historic Preservation Trust Fund, Account #T-12-56-850-115-667, Sub-Account #00028.

WHEREAS, the MONMOUTH CONSERVATION FOUNDATION has indicated it is willing to commission the necessary REMEDIAL INVESTIGATION by BRINKERHOFF ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES, INC., upon entering into an ADDENDUM TO THE PROJECT AGREEMENT with the COUNTY OF MONMOUTH that will provide reimbursement of direct out-of-pocket expenses to the MONMOUTH CONSERVATION FOUNDATION for the REMEDIAL INVESTIGATION.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the MONMOUTH COUNTY BOARD OF RECREATION COMMISSIONERS does hereby RECOMMEND to the MONMOUTH COUNTY BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS that the ENTERING INTO an ADDENDUM TO THE PROJECT AGREEMENT between the COUNTY OF MONMOUTH and the MONMOUTH CONSERVATION FOUNDATION be AUTHORIZED so that a REMEDIAL INVESTIGATION can be conducted by BRINKERHOFF ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES, INC.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the MONMOUTH COUNTY BOARD OF RECREATION COMMISSIONERS does also hereby RECOMMEND to the BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS that an additional \$100,000.00 to the MONMOUTH CONSERVATION FOUNDATION be AUTHORIZED to cover the REMEDIAL INVESTIGATION by BRINKERHOFF ENVIRONMENTAL SERIVCES, INC., in accordance with the PROJECT AGREEMENT between the COUNTY OF MONMOUTH and the MONMOUTH CONSERVATION FOUNDATION for SWIMMING RIVER PARK.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the MONMOUTH COUNTY BOARD OF RECREATION COMMISSIONERS does also hereby RECOMMEND to the BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS that the BOARD OF RECREATION COMMISSIONERS be AUTHORIZED to SUBMIT TO THE NEW JERSEY HAZARDOUS DISCHARGE SITE REMEDIATION FUND (HDSRF), on behalf of the COUNTY OF MONMOUTH, all documentation necessary to secure grant reimbursement for eligible environmental costs and expenditures.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the MONMOUTH COUNTY BOARD OF RECREATION COMMISSIONERS does also hereby RECOMMEND to the BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS that the BOARD OF RECREATION COMMISSIONERS be AUTHORIZED to continue to act on behalf of the COUNTY OF MONMOUTH to effect the REMEDIAL INVESTIGATION and the ENVIRONMENTAL REMEDIATION of SWIMMING RIVER PARK.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be sent to the Clerk of the Monmouth County Board of Chosen Freeholders, the County Administrator, County Counsel, and to the Monmouth Conservation Foundation.
