PUBLIC MEETING ON DRAFT MONMOUTH COUNTY SEWER SERVICE AREA

Public Notice


Take notice that the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (Department) is holding a public meeting on a proposed draft sewer service area map as part of Monmouth County's planning efforts to update the Monmouth County Water Quality Management (WQM) Plan. This draft sewer service area was submitted by the Monmouth County Planning Board and is a preliminary working draft subject to change. The map was developed in coordination with and reviewed by the Department, county and municipalities. This map reflects proposed changes in wastewater service area designations to eliminate conflicts with environmentally sensitive areas and local planning objectives. Projects that have received both local approvals and Department wastewater approvals have not been removed from the future sewer service area. Sites that have been demonstrated not to include environmentally sensitive areas have not been removed from the future sewer service area. If you believe that property has been mistakenly removed from the draft sewer service area because that property has prior valid local and wastewater approvals or you have information demonstrating that a GIS data layer is incorrect, please submit that information in writing to both the county and the Department.

A public meeting to discuss the proposed changes in sewer service area designation has been scheduled for August 24, 2010 from 5:30pm to 8:30pm in the Monmouth County Library headquarters located at 125 Symmes Drive, Manalapan, New Jersey. The Department and county will accept comments and information related to this map from the date of posting until September 24, 2010, 30 days after the public meeting.

Based upon information received in response to this public comment period final adjustments may be made to the map after the close of the public comment period. Please

note there will be an additional formal public comment process prior to plan adoption.

Interested persons may submit written comments on the draft map to WQM Program Docket, Division of Land Use Regulation, at the Department of Environmental Protection, P.O. All comments must be submitted within 30 days following the public meeting.
