ORDINANCE #08-2013

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 115 "FLOOD DAMAGE PREVENTION" AND CHAPTER 130, "LAND USE" OF THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF SEA BRIGHT, 1998

BE IT ORDAINED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Sea Bright in the County of Monmouth, State of New Jersey that Chapter 115 entitled "Flood Damage Prevention" and Chapter 130 entitled "Land Use" of an Ordinance entitled "Code of the Borough of Sea Bright, 1998", be and the same is hereby amended and supplemented in the following manner:

SECTION 1

CHAPTER 115 "Flood Damage Prevention"

A. Article II, Definitions, Sub-section 115.5 Word usages; terms defined is hereby amended and supplemented to read as follows with all other section not listed remaining the same.

REPETITIVE LOSS – Flood related damages sustained by a structure on two (2) separate occasions during a 10-year period for which the cost of repairs at the time of each such flood event, on the average, equals or exceeds twenty-five (25%) percent of the market value of the structure before the damage occurred.

SUBSTANTIAL DAMAGE - Damage of any origin sustained by a structure whereby the cost of restoring the structure to it's before damaged condition would equal or exceed 50% of the market value of the structure before the damage occurred. Substantial Damage shall also mean flood related damage sustained by a structure on two (2) separate occasions during a 10-year period for which the cost of repairs at the time of each such flood event, on the average, equals or exceeds 25 (25%) percent of the market value of the structure before the damage occurred.

SUBSTANTIAL IMPROVEMENT - Any reconstruction, rehabilitation, addition, or other improvement of a structure, the cost of which exceeds 50% of the market value of the structure before the start of construction of the improvement. When the combined total of all improvements or repairs made after the adoption of this regulation equals or exceeds fifty (50%) percent of a structure's market value, that structure is considered to be substantially improved. This term includes structures, which have incurred substantial damage, regardless of the actual repair work performed. The term does not, however, include either:

- A. Any project for improvement of a structure to correct existing violations of state or local health, sanitary or safety code specifications which have been identified by the local code enforcement officer and which are the minimum necessary to assure safe living conditions; or
- B. Any alteration of a historic structure, provided that the alteration will not preclude the structure's continued designation as a historic structure.

SECTION 1I

CHAPTER 130 "Land Use"

B. Article II, Definitions and Word Usage, Sub-section 130.4 Word usages; terms defined is hereby amended and supplemented to read as follows with all other section not listed remaining the same.

REPETITIVE LOSS – Flood related damages sustained by a structure on two (2) separate occasions during a 10-year period for which the cost of repairs at the time of each such flood event, on the average, equals or exceeds twenty-five (25%) percent of the market value of the structure before the damage occurred.

SUBSTANTIAL DAMAGE - Damage of any origin sustained by a structure whereby the cost of restoring the structure to it's before damaged condition would equal or exceed 50% of the market value of the structure before the damage occurred. Substantial Damage shall also mean flood related damage sustained by a structure on two (2) separate occasions during a 10-year period for which the cost of repairs at the time of each such flood event, on the average, equals or exceeds 25 (25%) percent of the market value of the structure before the damage occurred.

SECTION III

All other ordinances or parts thereof enacted prior to the adoption of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SECTION IV

If any section, paragraph, subparagraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjusted invalid such subparagraph, clause or provision so adjudged and the remainder of the ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.

SECTION V

This ordinance shall take effect as provided by law after its final passage.
