STEPS TO AMEND YOUR SCO (Source: NJDEP)

- 1. Revise and propose an amended Stormwater Control Ordinance (SCO), using either of NJDEP's updated model SCO(s) with any appropriate details that are unique to your town.
- 2. Conduct public notices and readings as required for your town. Once complete, the town must adopt their amended SCO.
- 3. Email the adopted SCO to your county review agency:
 - a. The county review agency has 60 calendar days to respond with approval, conditional approval, or disapproval notice;
 - b. If conditional approval is granted, the municipality must make the county's requested changes or otherwise resolve the county's concerns before the SCO becomes effective;
 - c. If, after the 60 days has elapsed, the county has not responded, the SCO shall be deemed approved; and
 - d. The SCO is effective immediately upon county approval.
- 4. Post the approved SCO on your dedicated municipal website within 30 days of its effective date.
- 5. Once posted, notify:
 - a. your MS4 Case Manager at the Department;
 - b. your local Soil Conservation District
