#### PROJECT LIFESAVER

Project Lifesaver's mission is to use state of the art technology to find persons with Alzheimer's disease or other related mental dysfunction disorders who wander and become lost.

A lost person with Alzheimer's disease or other related dementia disorder represents a critical emergency. They are often unaware of their situation. They may not call out for help and sometimes do not respond to people calling out to them.

Project Lifesaver consists of a bracelet with a radio-tracking device that allows Sheriff's Officers to locate the wearer in the event the person become lost.

This program can help ease the concern of caregivers who are trying to cope with wandering behaviors.

#### RAPID RESPONSE



- **+** Battery-powered bracelet
- **↓** Weight equals one ounce
- Emits a radio-tracking signal 24 hours a day

The Monmouth County Sheriff's Office can respond rapidly in the event that the wearer becomes missing. The Project Lifesaver program was developed by the Chesapeake Sheriff's Office in Virginia. Hundreds of rescues have taken place with the use of Project Lifesaver. The average rescue time remains under 30 minutes.

#### How do I apply?

To obtain an application, call the Monmouth County Office on Aging at the above numbers and ask for an application for the Project Lifesaver tracking bracelet.

#### How much will it cost?

Currently, there are grant funds available to cover the cost of the transmitter, batteries and ongoing maintenance of the unit. In the future, there may be a charge for the program.

## Who will supply replacement batteries and bracelets?

Personnel from the Monmouth County Sheriff's Office will visit the home once per month or once every sixty days to change the battery and replace the bracelet.

## What happens after I complete the application?

The Monmouth County Office on Aging will order your tracking device and the Sheriff's Office will call to make an appointment to install the bracelet at your home.

## If a Project Lifesaver participant is found to be missing:

- 1. Call local police immediately, and inform them the missing person is equipped with a Project Lifesaver tracking device issued by the Monmouth County Sheriff's Office.
