

Minutes of a Regular Meeting of the  
MONMOUTH COUNTY SOLID WASTE ADVISORY COUNCIL

I. Meeting Opening –Attendance

The meeting was opened at 7:00 PM by Chairman Johnson. It was announced the meeting was being held in compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act, P.L. 1975, Chapter 231.

On a motion by Straus, seconded by Branch, and approved unanimously, the minutes for the September 15, 2016 meeting was approved.

II. Correspondence, Reports and Announcements

There was no SWAC Member Reports.

Metzger mentioned the last Paper Shredding Event was very well attended in Belmar. Recycling tonnage of paper continues to grow each year. She will begin preparing the 2017 schedule after the New Year.

Regular Business

Newman reported that the request on 10/28 from F&F Farmland in Holmdel looks good and on 11/2/16 they starting accepting leaves.

Newman introduced representatives, Pat Ward and John Rey from Resource Engineering's team. They are applying for the inclusion into the Solid Waste Management Plan proposing 1500 tons per day on Randolph Rd. Howell. They currently have a Class B Center at that location. The process began September, 2015, but engineers and fire marshals have lingering paperwork. Resource Engineering is seeking to build in one phase full circle. The company will accept gypsum, wood, and concrete for crushing. Engineers have done some changes on the site plan requirements e.g. building setbacks,

landscaping, buffer areas. Howell Fire Bureau is looking at the truck turning, using a 4<sup>th</sup> driveway for emergency, safety gates, fencing (6 foot), for security. Resource Engineering will install at the intersection a signal light. Their largest truck will be 69 foot entering and exiting off Randolph Rd with K turn ability. Straus asked if hydrants for fire suppression will be installed. Ward informed the SWAC that the biggest truck (69 foot) will have k-turn ability. Boodey stated that 75 transfer trailer trucks would probably bring in the 1500 tons.

Newman reported Mazza & Sons currently is in the Monmouth County Solid Waste Plan with a maximum capacity of 110 tons per day, they are seeking an increase to 300 tons per day. They are waiting to hear from the County Traffic Engineer regarding left turn vs right turns. Traffic along Shafto Rd. is a big concern. Lomangino asked about putting a traffic light, Mazza does not believe the need for one but waiting for the traffic report. Straus asked "how many trucks will be going in and out, Mazza said 42 inbound and 8 outbound. Newman said he expects further information in January.

Newman and Throckmorton reported that the County has applied to the NJDEP for the expansion of the Monmouth County Reclamation Center known as Phase IV Expansion for a valleyfill within the existing landfill site. This will take place between the existing Phase II and Phase III portion on the footprint of the existing Demolition Landfill. The expansion will cover approximately 30 acres of footprint area with an elevation increase to 300 feet above MSL across the top of Phase II and III. This will be 42 to 50 feet above the currently approved elevation. The hope is this will add on an additional 12-15 years to the life of the Landfill. A motion was made to move to accept the plan by Boodey and seconded by McArthur. Newman said he will prepare a Freeholder Resolution and have a meeting with Tinton Falls in early January and would also have the meeting publicly noticed. All in favor to move forward.

Newman updated the TDMA status, to date he has 45 applications sent to the NJDEP. A couple of the towns will need to find other locations because of Green Acre issues.

Metzger said the Countys are waiting to see what the Governor is going to do with the proposed legislation for e-waste management. It is on the Governor's desk for signature. If he was to sign the legislation it would give relief to towns and countys disposing of these materials.

There being no further business there was a motion by McArthur and seconded by Lomangino for adjournment at 8:20 pm.
