

**Minutes of a Regular Meeting of the
Monmouth County Solid Waste Advisory Council**

Thursday January 19, 2017

Monmouth County Reclamation Center

6000 Asbury Ave. Tinton Falls, NJ

I. Meeting Opening – Attendance

The meeting was opened at 7:00 pm by Chairman Johnson. It was announced the meeting was being held in compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act, P.L. 1975, Chapter 231.

Members took a vote for the 2017 officers of the Solid Waste Advisory Council.

Chairman – Posten nominated Johnson, all in favor.

Vice Chairman – Posten nominated Boodey, all in favor

Secretary - Johnson nominated Newman, all in favor

Recording Secretary – Posten nominated Metzger, all in favor

On a motion by Posten, seconded by Straus, and approved unanimously, the minutes for the December 15, 2016 meeting was approved.

II. Correspondence, Reports and Announcements

Branch spoke on asphalt recycling. He questioned why there is a problem with millings enforcement and permitting. The material cannot be used as surface application because particles are not safe and there is a presence of airborne dust. It is getting more difficult to get rid of the material. Concrete moves easily, the NJDEP have not regulated it as much.

Boodey questioned whether the County and towns have received the REA money. Metzger said recently the towns received the 2014 grant money. The County has not received their grant money.

Metzger reported the e-waste Bill was signed by the Governor, there is no plan in place with the NJDEP on how the program will work. Meetings will follow.

Mr. Castner (representing Gold Star Paving) in Morganville, NJ gave an overview of the application. Increased tonnage from 300 tons p/day to 800 tons p/day, 3,000 tons weekly. Truck traffic will not make left hand turns out of facility and signage will be posted. The company will process concrete and asphalt masonry material. Gold Star has been in this location since 2004, they have expanded a couple of times. They will be operating 6 days p/week M –F 7 am – 5 pm & Sat. 7 am – 12 pm. The site sits on 9.9 acres, little over 3 acres is operating area. The expectation is 20 ton trucks approximately 65-70 p/day. There was a motion to pass forward to the Freeholders, Boodey introduced the motion, seconded by Posten, all in favor.

Resource Engineering update by Mr. Ward, The company has modified layout the driveway will be closer to the west with a landscape screen. They have estimated 20 trucks stacking the driveway also added another scale. The company needs to stay away from JCP&L by 70 feet from the high tension wires. The existing Class B will remain in the footprint as well as wood recycling and concrete crushing. The size of the building will be 270' x 130'. They have been working with the County and Township staff. They expect to move 20,000 yards p/day equaling 15-20 trucks. Branch asked about building codes, fire suppression & hydrant. Ward stated DCA will oversee. Johnson asked for clarification of their Waste Management Plan. Ward said they will get back to SWAC.

Mazza Recycling Services going for a Class "A" expansion. Discussion about the need for a traffic light. Newman said there will be an Engineering Traffic Survey. Lomangino questioned applicant about light MFG zone light manufacturer.

Newman reported the MCRC Valley fill a Solid Waste Management Plan Amendment will be heard at a Public Hearing on March 9, 2017 in Freehold. Tinton Falls has no objection.

TDMA's – Newman reported progress, the County OEM is pushing the DEP. So far, seven TDMA permits were issued and nine permits are pending.

HHW Facility has taken in more material than last year, 892,683 pounds of material and over 11,000 Participants. Hours have been extended and no appointments are necessary.

There being no further business there was a motion by Posten, seconded by Lomangino for adjournment at 8:19 p.m.
