1	The <i>Monmouth</i> was perhaps the first locomotive used in Monmouth County, on the Freehold & Jamesburg Agricultural Railroad that began operations in 1853.	
2	In the 1920s, buses in Monmouth County included Packards and Reo Speedwagons.	
3	At the air show in Interlaken in 1910, Wilbur Wright introduced to the public the first five-seat airplane.	
4	During Prohibition, the flying boat known as the <i>High Ball Express</i> took passengers from Keyport to “wet” destinations in the Caribbean.	
5	The first world bicycle racing champion, Arthur Zimmerman, had a bicycle factory in Freehold in the 1890s.	
6	The old Central Railroad of New Jersey’s right of way near Raritan Bay now forms part of The Henry Hudson Trail of the Monmouth Parks System.	
7	James P. Allaire, who owned the bog iron works in Howell, built some of the first engines for steamboats, including the <i>Savannah</i> , the first to cross the Atlantic.	
8	In 1865, President Abraham Lincoln met with military leaders on the Keyport-built steamboat <i>River Queen</i> , which after the war provided service to Long Branch.	
9	For many decades, driving in Ocean Grove was prohibited on Sundays.	
10	In the early 1870s, financier Jay Gould was the President of the New Jersey Southern Railroad, which later was absorbed by New Jersey Central.	
11	The “all-rail route” from Jersey City to Monmouth County, completed in 1875 by New Jersey Central, was made possible by a new bridge at Perth Amboy.	
12	William Gehlhaus’ lengthy pier at Keansburg, built in 1908, enabled steamboats to dock at low tide and hence, more frequently.	
13	Beginning in 1865, the Long Branch and Seashore Railroad ran between Sandy Hook and Long Branch.	
14	The “crisscross bridge” at Highlands featured a road sharing space with railroad tracks.	
15	Popular steamboats operating between New York and Monmouth County beginning in the 1880s included the <i>Albertina</i> , <i>Sea Bird</i> , <i>Monmouth</i> , and <i>Sandy Hook</i> .	
16	Sailing out of a new terminal owned by Monmouth County, ferries began service from Belford to Manhattan in 2002.	
17	Ovid Tuzeneu of Middletown became a folk hero in the 1890s by chopping down toll gates and suing turnpike companies.	
18	From 1929 to 1941, a deluxe train, <i>The Blue Comet</i> , sped between Jersey City and Atlantic City, with stops in Monmouth County.	
19	In 1907, more than 345 million passengers rode street and electric railways in New Jersey, including more than 9 million in Monmouth County.	
20	The Garden State Parkway, which had a major impact on the Jersey Shore, was largely completed by 1954.
