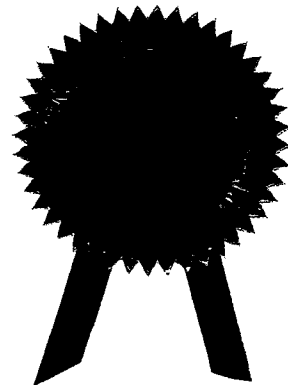

Whereas, many falls are preventable, and seniors are encouraged to have regular exercise, wear the correct footwear, improve lighting and reduce clutter from walk paths and stairways, use non-skid liners under rugs, have eyeglass prescriptions checked once a year and review medicines for those with side effects such as weakness or dizziness; and

Whereas, the Monmouth County Office on Aging is working to raise awareness and promote greater understanding of how preventing falls can reduce injuries, loss of mobility, independence and death in our older citizens.

“Fall Prevention Awareness Week”

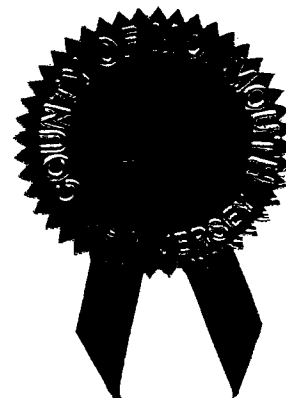

"Kiwanis Club of Asbury Park Day"

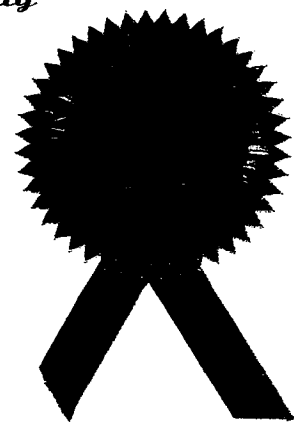

WHEREAS, from the beginning of his career in county government Ted was an advocate for, and a champion of the Monmouth County Library System, recognizing the multitude of benefits a library brings to the children and adults of a community; and






