WHEREAS, in the 1880's, a Jewish community existed Freehold which steadily grew until, in 1909, it became large enough to rent a small hall on the corner of Main and Court Streets for the High Holidays; and

WHEREAS, in 1911, charter was drawn up for the formation of an Orthodox Synagogue, Congregation Agudath Achim Anshai, a small wooden structure was erected on a lot at First and Center Streets and the Jewish community's desire to build a Synagogue of its own was realized

WHEREAS, from humble beginnings, the Congregation Agudath Achim - which through the years became known as The Freehold Jewish Center, has continued to grow and meet the needs of the Jewish Community with membership from Freehold and the surrounding towns with its commitment to a traditional pattern of Jewish worship, and sensitivity to the spiritual needs of its congregants; and

WHEREAS, the Freehold Jewish Center has traditional Sabbath and High Holiday worship services, daily Minyans, Hebrew School, adult education programs and numerous activities that enrich Jewish heritage, promote Jewish values and move forward toward the future providing opportunities for worship and study to members of all ages.

Pancreatic Cancer Awareness Month

WHEREAS pancreatic cancer is currently the deadliest cancer in our nation, responsible for more than 35,000 deaths each year, and is currently rated as the fourth leading cause of cancer death in the United States; and

WHEREAS in 2011, an estimated 44,030 people will be diagnosed with pancreatic cancer in the United States and 37,660 will die from the disease; and

WHEREAS today, 74 percent of pancreatic cancer patients will die within the first year of their diagnosis, 94 percent of pancreatic cancer patients will die within the first five years, and there have been no significant improvements in early detection, treatment methods, or survival rates in the past 30 years; and

WHEREAS currently there is no cure for pancreatic cancer, and when symptoms present themselves, it is usually too late for an optimistic prognosis, with the average life expectancy of those diagnosed at three to six months; and

WHEREAS the Pancreatic Cancer Action Network is the first and only national patient advocacy organization serving the pancreatic cancer community both in Monmouth County and nationwide by focusing its efforts on public policy, research funding, patient services, and developing both effective treatments and a cure for pancreatic cancer.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Chosen Freeholders, joins the Pancreatic Cancer Action Network in their commitment to discovering a cure for this dreaded disease and proclaims the month of November 2011 as

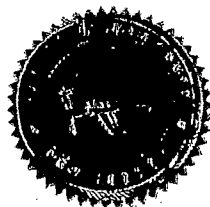
Recognition Certificate
