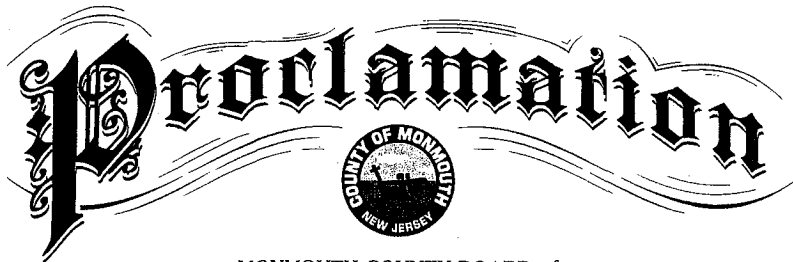


**WORK SESSION AGENDA ITEM #1 – PROCLAMATIONS**

WHEREAS, George H. Moss, Jr., has been a resident of the Borough of Rumson for more than 64 years was born in New York City and attended the Horace Mann School and the University of North Carolina, and


WHEREAS, on December 7, 1942, George H. Moss, Jr., enlisted in the military and for the duration of World War II served with the O.S.S. in Washington, D.C., and the Middle Eastern and European Theaters; and


WHEREAS, during his long and productive tenure as a well-respected historian, George H. Moss, Jr., contributed to newspapers, television documentaries and books, was appointed Historical Consultant to the Commanding General, Fort Hancock, was a cofounder and curator of the Sandy Hook Museum and served on the boards of the Monmouth County Historical Association, the Monmouth Museum, the Oceanic Free Library and the English Speaking Union; and

WHEREAS, George H. Moss, Jr., served as County Historian from 1999 through 2008, and some of the numerous awards bestowed upon him throughout the years included the Award of Recognition from the New Jersey Historical Commission, the Jane G. Clayton Award from the County of Monmouth, the Richard J. Hughes Award from the New Jersey Historical Commission

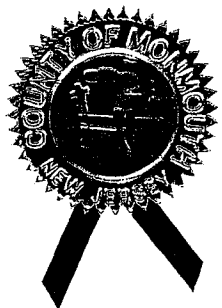
