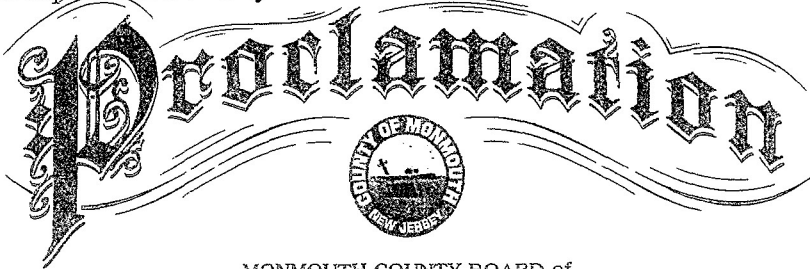

- There was a presentation of a Proclamation by **Freeholder Mallet** to the Pancreatic Cancer Action Network located in Monmouth County. September has been deemed Pancreatic Cancer Month. Following the presentation by **Freeholder Mallet**, the representative discussed pancreatic cancer and the inroads that have been made in helping to cure this dreaded disease and discussed various research aspects on a variety of cancers.

*Pancreatic Cancer Awareness Month*

WHEREAS pancreatic cancer is currently the deadliest cancer in our nation, responsible for more than 35,000 deaths each year, and is currently rated as the fourth leading cause of cancer death in the United States; and

WHEREAS today, 76 percent of pancreatic cancer patients will die within the first year of their diagnosis, 95 percent of pancreatic cancer patients will die within the first five years, and there have been no significant improvements in early detection, treatment methods, or survival rates in the past 30 years; and

WHEREAS currently there is no cure for pancreatic cancer, and when symptoms present themselves, it is usually too late for an optimistic prognosis, with the average life expectancy of those diagnosed at three to six months; and

WHEREAS the Pancreatic Cancer Action Network is the first and only national patient advocacy organization serving the pancreatic cancer community both in Monmouth County and nationwide by focusing its efforts on public policy, research funding, patient services, and developing both effective treatments and a cure for pancreatic cancer.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Chosen Freeholders, joins the Pancreatic Cancer Action Network in their commitment to discovering a cure for this dreaded disease and proclaims the month of November 2010 as

*"Pancreatic Cancer Awareness Month"*

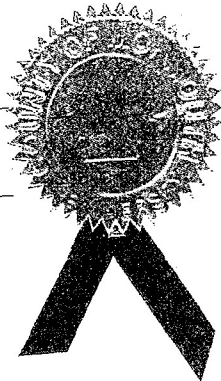

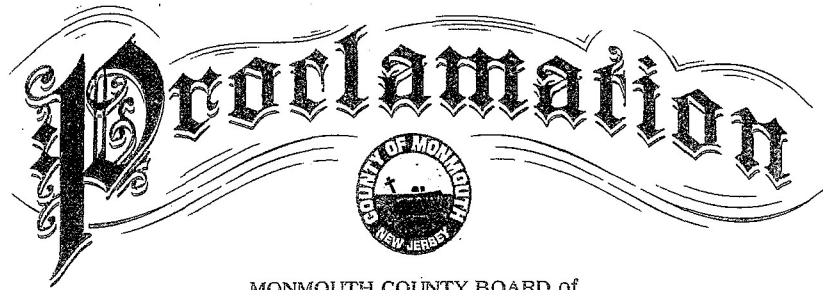

*WHEREAS, for the past 29 years as a staunch advocate for senior citizens as Executive Director of the Bayshore Senior Center, working to ensure that seniors have a safe comfortable place to seek companionship and enjoy their lives; and*

*WHEREAS, throughout the years, Sister Elizabeth Garvey, has served on many Boards concerning senior citizens, including the Monmouth Senior Citizens Advisory Board, Retired Senior Citizens Advisory Board, Coordinating Council of Monmouth County Office on Aging and the Keansburg Senior Citizens Advisory, and additionally she was appointed to the post of Commissioner of the Keansburg Housing Authority by then Governor Thomas Kean; and*

*WHEREAS, on October 9, 2010, Sister Elizabeth Garvey will celebrate her 50th anniversary as a member of the Sisters of Mercy.*
