Proposal for a restorative, delinquency prevention mentoring program offered to youth ages 9-12 residing in Monmouth County, with an emphasized focus on youth residing or attending school in the following high need municipalities: Asbury Park, Keansburg, Long Branch, and Neptune Township. Services will be offered individually and/or as small groups, based on unique needs of those enrolled.						
Collaborate with at minimum one Student Assistance Coordinator (SAC) in catchment area to support the reduction of bullying in specified age group. Mentoring will include parental involvement and nurtured heart strategies will be utilized through in-direct support in improving functioning in the home environment, as a supportive feature of the program.						
LOS – 24 youth served over 12-week period. Each youth will be offered 24 hours of direct mentoring, to include a 1-hour comprehensive assessment with the caregiver and an additional 3 hours of in-direct supportive services.
