NJ 4-H Loaner Goat Program

The State 4-H Goat Advisory Council has requested the inclusion of “loaner” goats in the State 4-H Goat Project and Show. The objective of this program is to include youth who do not have the resources to raise a 4-H goat project on their own. The 4-H Member will gain first hand experience in the management and showing of goats through the cooperation of local breeders or goat owners.

The project details follow in the Loaner Agreement.

NJ 4-H Loaner Goat Agreement

- The project begins the date the loan agreement is signed and ends at the completion of the State 4-H Goat Show, at the end of that project year.
- The 4-H Member must keep a 4-H Goat Project Record Book and a diary to document the actual time spent caring for the project animal. Care includes the number of visits and specific work/care performed.
- The 4-H Member is responsible for the care of the animal a minimum of 50% of the time. Care schedule will be worked out between the Owner of the animal and the project member.
- The project goat must be a registered project animal as of May 1 of the current year. (With the exception of kids born to a qualified project doe after May 1.)
- All Loaner Goat Agreements must be filed with the county extension office by May 1 of the current project year.
- At the end of the project year, the 4-H Member and the Goat Owner may choose to renew the agreement/contract for another year.
- 4-H loaner project animals who have qualified at their county show, are eligible to be shown only at the State 4-H Invitational Goat Show (Not the AGDA sanctioned portion of the show). This is in compliance with AGDA rules.
- All State 4-H Goat Show Rules apply to this project.
