

**Minutes of a Regular Meeting of the  
Monmouth County Solid Waste Advisory Council  
Thursday, March 14, 2019  
Monmouth County Reclamation Center  
6000 Asbury Ave. Tinton Falls, NJ**

I. Meeting Opening – Attendance

The meeting was opened at 7:03 pm by Vice Chairman Boodey. It was announced the meeting was being held in compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act, P.L. 1975, Chapter 231.

I. **Old Business**

**Approval of minutes from the January 17, 2019, meeting moved by Boodey, seconded by Straus, and unanimously passed.**

II. **Regular Business**

Vice Chairman Boodey asked for a motion for the election of Chairman, Johnson nominated Lomangino Throckmorton seconded the vote, all in favor unanimously passed. Vice Chairman, Straus nominated Rainforth, Throckmorton seconded, all

in favor. Secretary, Bodey nominated Newman, Posten seconded, all in favor. Recording Secretary, Posten nominated Metzger, Throckmorton seconded, all in favor.

Metzger provided a report on recycling. The County partnered with Holmdel Township with advertising the Second Chance Toys program. Gently used toys will be cleaned and distributed to various agencies for a donation to less privileged children. This also helps keeping plastic toys from reaching the landfill. Metzger said she has been asked to do several speaking engagements on recycling, e.g. Environmental Commissions, Beach Improvement Association, NJ Association of Designated Persons, Women's Club and School Environmental Fairs.

Metzger reported on the RFP with Atlantic Coast Fibers, the county is waiting for some more information to be provided. Progress has been slow.

Newman reported on the Solid Waste and Recycling Master Plan Update. He said Mr. DeFeo is working on a study of the tonnages and materials the county generates. There will be a points system when looking at the facilities in the county. Newman is providing information to DeFeo on conceptual ideas and a map of all facilities. DeFeo should have a draft by April 19, 2019. Johnson suggested to Newman to look at NJDEP solid waste reports. He said they have good data. Lomangino asked if it included existing facilities or expansions. Newman went through the process in his explanation. Lomangino questioned the landfill extension; Newman said he would refer to Geoff for an answer. He will report at a further date.

A letter will be issued next Monday for the Mazza traffic light to certify that they will have increased Class A tonnage from 110 tons to 300 tons limit.

Resource Engineering application – Newman met with the traffic engineer now that Ramtown/Greenville Rd. is open, the study will begin soon, no timeline set.

Lomangino addressed many of the Tinton Falls folks that attended the SWAC meeting. They are very concerned with the ongoing daily problems with odors. The residents are planning a class action lawsuit and they are looking for some

response from SWAC members. SWAC members listened closely to what the residents had to say.

There being no further business there was a motion by Straus seconded by Throckmorton for adjournment at 8:22 p.m.
