RESOLUTION TO INDICATE POSITIVE INTEREST OF
THE BOROUGH OF MANASQUAN IN SECURING COVERAGE
UNDER THE NATIONAL FLOOD INSURANCE PROGRAM

WHEREAS, The Mayor and Council of the Borough of Manasquan, being cognizant of the recurring flooding and the threat of flooding of tidal waters from the Manasquan River estuary and the various streams and other bodies of water connecting thereto and the resulting damage to property located within the Borough of Manasquan; and

WHEREAS, there is a desire and need for a program of insurance coverage for those who reside or hold title to property located within such flood-prone areas; and

WHEREAS, National Flood Insurance can be made available to such persons through the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968 as amended and supplemented; and

WHEREAS, The regulations promulgated by the Federal Insurance Administrator under said Act require: (1) an official legislative or executive act indicating a local need for flood insurance and a desire to participate in the National Flood Insurance Program and (2) assurances in form of action by the appropriate local legislative body committing the local legislative body to certain future courses of action; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Manasquan is the appropriate local legislative body under both the authority delegated to it by the Municipal Zoning Enabling Act (NJSA 40:55-30 et seq.) to regulate the use of land by enacting flood regulations and the Municipal Authority for Local Improvements (NJSA 40:56-1 et seq.) to define waterways and prevent encroachment against them.

Now, Therefore, Be it Resolved by The Mayor and Council
of the Borough of Manasquan:

That the Borough of Manasquan hereby evidences a positive
interest in securing flood insurance coverage under The National
Flood Insurance Program because of a clear danger of flooding
and the resultant damage to property in the Borough of Manasquan;
and

That it will comply with the regulations of the National
Flood Insurance Program to:

- (a) recognize and evaluate flood hazards in all actions relating to land use in the flood plain areas having special flood hazards.
- (b) enact by December 31, 1971, and maintain in force for those areas, reasonable land use and control measures with effective enforcement provisions consistent with the criteria set forth in the regulations as now promulgated by the Federal Insurance Administrator.
- (c) cooperate with neighboring jurisdictions with respect to adjoining drainage areas and flood plains in order to prevent the aggravation of the flooding problem in the plain areas.
- (d) take such other official action as may be reasonably necessary to carry out the objectives of the program, including but not limited to:
 - (1) furnishing on request by an appropriate Federal or State agency or by a designated representative of the National Insurers Association, information for each structure constructed within the area of special flood hazards, after flood insurance is first made available in the community, concerning its first floor elevation and if there is a basement, the distance down from the first floor to the bottom of the lowest opening where water flowing over the ground would enter; and
 - (2) assisting the Federal Insurance Administrator and/or the State of New Jersey in further delineating, on available local maps of sufficient scale to identify the location of structures, the limits of the flood plain having special flood hazards as identified by the Administrator pursuant to Section 1360 of the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968; and

That an original dwelling erected on the property was destroyed by fire in May of 1970. That there is no adjacent land available to make the lot conform to the Zoning Ordinance. That the properties in the immediate vicinity are primarily one family dwellings which are built on lots having an average width of 33 and 35 feet and that by reason of the size of the lot concerning the premises in question there is created an exceptional situation, and if the Zoning Ordinance was to be strictly enforced the applicant would be denied the full use of his property, and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that the relief requested by appellant can be granted without substantial detriment to the public good and without substantially impairing the intent and purpose of the Zone Plan and Zoning Ordinance of the Borough of Manasquan;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Adjustment of the Borough of Manasquan on this 9th day of December, 1970, that approval of the application of Frederick C. Rimmele be recommended to the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Manasquan, in accordance with RS 40:55-39.D.

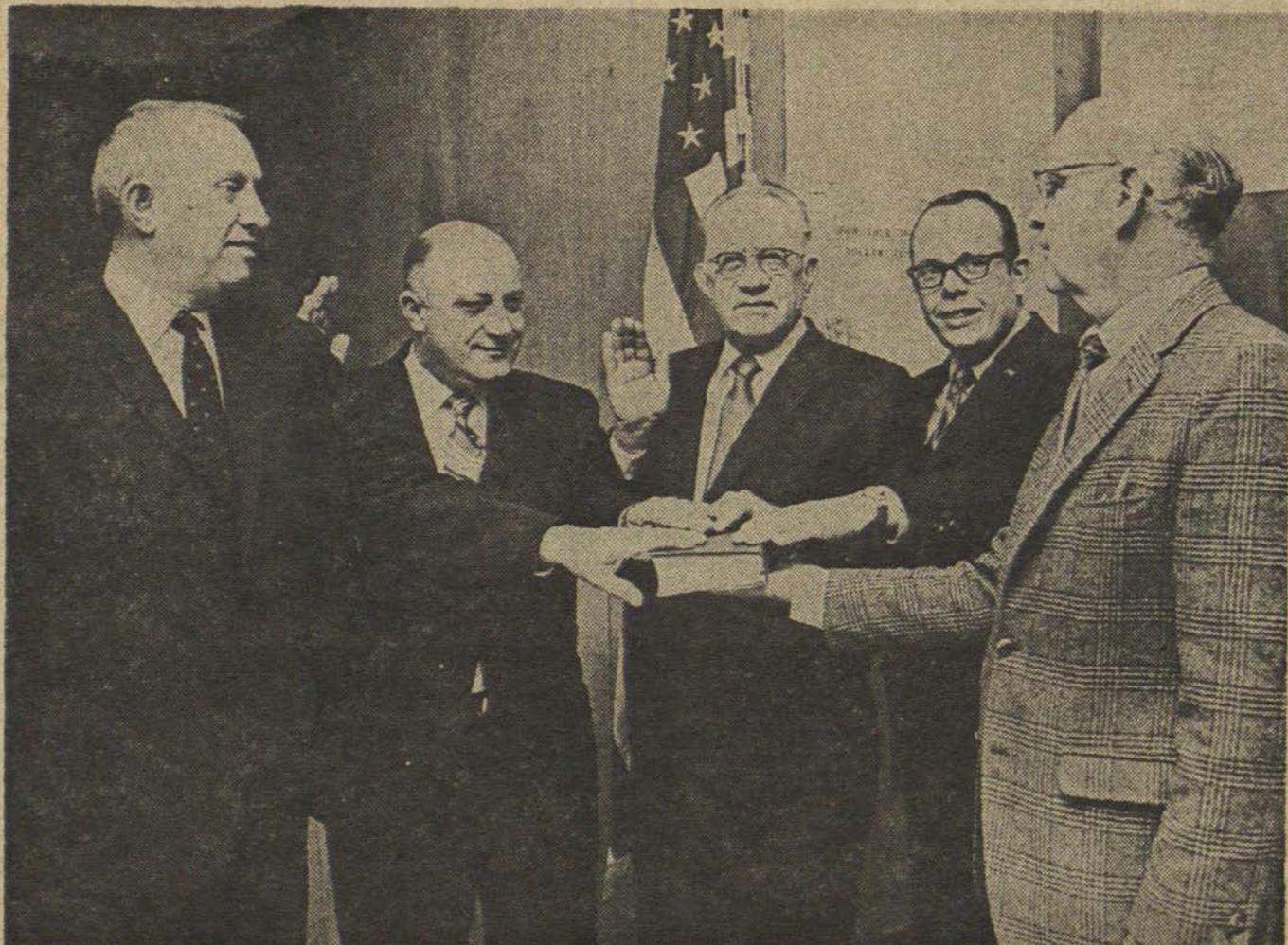

A regular meeting of the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Manasquan, N. J. was held on Monday evening May 3, 1971 at 8 o'clock P. M. with Mayor Stuart R. Hancock presiding. The meeting opened with silent prayer and salute to our flag. Councilmen Baker, Blair, Herrmann, Jones, Lockenmeyer and Skokos, were present. The minutes of the meeting held on the 26th day of April 1971 were read and approved as read.

Councilman Lockenmeyer read the following resolution in full, and moved its adoption.

RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED that the Borough Council of the Borough of Manasquan, in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A.34:13A-1, et seq. adopt the following negotiation procedure for Borough employees with a recognized exclusive representative in an appropriate collective negotiating unit:

1. Whenever a negotiable matter involving conditions of employment is to be considered, a request for negotiations shall first be submitted to the other side in writing before September 1st next preceding the budget year in which the matter is to take effect.
2. In the case of negotiation of grievances, the time for the presentation of the request for negotiations shall be provided in the grievance procedure to be agreed upon as a result of negotiation between representatives of the Borough of Manasquan and the exclusive representative and signed by the parties.
3. Initial discussions shall be conducted as a result of a meeting between a representative of each side, and negotiations shall not begin until all materials intended to be relied upon are accumulated for study.
4. The Borough Council reserves the right to negotiate as a committee of the whole or through committees or members of the Borough Council or by persons employed by the Borough Council.

5. All negotiation sessions shall take place at such times and places as are convenient to the negotiators, except where there is a disagreement all meetings shall be conducted in the Borough Council's chambers at the Borough Hall, Manasquan, N. J., between the hours of 7:30 P. M. and 10:30 P.M. on week days and 10:00 A.M. and 4:00 P.M. on Saturdays.

6. No special compensation will be allowed to representatives of the exclusive representative for attendance at negotiation sessions, and it shall be the responsibility of the exclusive representative to chose persons not responsible to be employed or on duty at the time of the negotiations.

7. After an agenda has been prepared by the negotiators before the beginning of negotiations and as each item on the agenda is agreed upon, it shall be reduced to writing and signed by all the parties.

8. In all other respects, negotiations between the parties shall be conducted in accordance with N.J.S.A.34:13A-1, et seq., and the Rules and Regulations and Statement of Procedure adopted by the Public Employment Relations Commission August 29, 1969, and such amendments thereto shall take effect hereafter.

RESOLUTION Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-48 RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, an emergency has arisen with respect to reconstruction of sanitary sewer lines in that a recent engineering study has revealed that more extensive work is required on certain lines on Second Avenue in the Borough of Manasquan in order to restore the same to a proper operating condition which was not contemplated in the formulation of the 1971 budget; and

WHEREAS, no adequate provision was made in the 1971 budget for the aforesaid purposes and N.J.S.A. 40A:4-46 provides for the creation of an emergency appropriation for the purposes above mentioned; and

WHEREAS, the total amount of emergency appropriation required, including all appropriations established by this Resolution, is \$9,000.00 and that 3% of the total operating appropriations in the budget of this Borough for the year 1971 is \$30,884.93.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS Humble Oil and Refining Company, hereinafter referred to as "Humble", has applied to the Board of Adjustment of the Borough of Manasquan for permission to erect a new "Esso" gasoline service station on the premises located at the southwest corner of Main Street and Union Avenue (Route 71), Borough of Manasquan, subject to the granting of certain variances and approval of the erection of said station, pursuant to the provisions of the Zoning Ordinance of the Borough of Manasquan, said premises being more specifically known as Lots 120 through 124, inclusive, Block 65 on the Tax Map of the Borough of Manasquan, which premises are in B-1 - Business zone; and

WHEREAS, the Board, after carefully considering the evidence presented by appellant and of the adjoining property owners and general public, has made the following factual findings;

That Humble has acquired options, subject to the granting of a variance, to purchase the five aforementioned lots in Block 65 from their present owners^{and} to demolish the existing structures comprising the BP Station, the Sharp Building and the Squan Furniture Building, and to erect, on the northerly portion of the property, a new Esso Service Station, which is to be a brick masonry structure accommodating three service bays and three pump islands, with landscaping and shrubbery, all of which are to be in keeping with the esthetics of an up-to-date, modern service station facility, and that the construction of the building, as well as the facilities, comply and in most instances exceed the standards required by the National Fire Underwriters Code.

That the access for traffic, both ingress and egress, will be by driveway openings in conformity with requisite traffic engineering practice and, in all respects, comply with the standards required by the New Jersey Department of Transportation (State Highway Department), and which will not only control the speed of vehicles entering and leaving the station, but also afford greater safety to pedestrians, particularly schoolchildren.

That the proposed location of the building, the underground storage tanks, have been so engineered and will be installed in such a manner as to present a minimum of hazard with respect to fire.

That the removal of the existing buildings and the proposed location of the new service station will give greater sight distance at the intersection for vehicular traffic on both Main Street and Union Avenue.

That the proposed free-standing sign, which will be an "Esso Oval", located at the northeast corner of the service station area, will be of sufficient height to permit motorists to make a proper determination, should they wish to enter the station, at a greater sight distance, thereby avoiding traffic hazard and abrupt determination for ingress and egress to the station, and that said sign will not rotate and will not have any flashing lights.

1. The applicant, in going forward with its construction, amend its plan and reserve therein a portion of land, not less than ten feet in width, immediately adjoining the northerly side of Old Squan Plaza, and extending throughout the entire length of the applicant's property, said reservation being for the purpose of widening Old Squan Plaza at a subsequent date.

2. The applicant construct sidewalks to the north of the reserved section for street widening, as called for in Item 1 above, same extending from Union Avenue to the westerly line of the applicant's property.

3. All parking of vehicles in the applicant's service station area shall be limited to those parking spots delineated on the plan as presented to the Board of Adjustment.

4. No disabled, derelict or inoperative vehicles are to be parked or stored on the premises at any time, nor are any new or used vehicles to be parked or stored on the property for purposes of reselling same.

5. All trash, refuse, disposable debris, including, but not limited to, used or discarded tires, shall be stored at all times in an enclosed area.

6. Upon the sale of the premises presently owned by the applicant, same being located at the northeast corner of Union and Curtis Avenues, a deed restriction be set forth in the Deed, prohibiting the use of said facility as a service station operation, same being in accordance with the letter of intent submitted by Humble under date of May 13, 1971.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Adjustment does approve the erection of said service station facility as a special exception, pursuant to Article XI, Section 81 (i), in accordance with R.S. 40:55-39 (b).

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R E S O L U T I O N

WHEREAS, DAVID J. LAIRD and ROBERT F. LAIRD have applied to the Board of Adjustment of the Borough of Manasquan for permission to construct an automatic automobile cleaning station at premises located on Parker Avenue, Borough of Manasquan, and known as Block 52, Lot 48 on the Tax Map of the Borough of Manasquan, which premises are in a I Zone; and

WHEREAS, the Board, after carefully considering the evidence presented by appellant and of the adjoining property owners and general public, has made the following factual findings:

That applicant has a contract to purchase Lot 48, Block 52, on the official tax map which said lot encompasses an area 50 feet in width along Parker Avenue, (Rt. Hwy. #71) and extends to the New York and Long Branch Right of Way to a mean depth of 223 feet, plus or minus;

That the plan submitted as exhibit A-4 shows the proposed entry of vehicles in two lanes along the southerly side of said lot with a turn to the rear (180°) to enter a one story masonry car wash;

That the plan marked exhibit A-6 sets forth the equipment and layout prepared by Hanna Industries, the manufacturer of the equipment, same being Pacesetter 100 Automatic Car-wash system and which per the testimony is a wholly contained wash and dry unit which can accommodate 3 cars during the wash process, that the entire plan including ingress and egress of vehicles calls for the accommodation of 35 cars;

That the water consumption will be such that same will be controlled by a water reclamation system wherein 80% of the water will be reclaimed; that the maximum usage of water per car will be 8 gallons;

That a biodegradable detergent will be used which of itself will decompose in a 24 hour period; that no toxic

substance or combustible substances will be used in the operation of the car wash system; that no noise will be emanated from the operation of the machinery as all machinery is contained within the masonry structure;

That the design of the machine is such that 100 cars can be completely washed per hour and that the entire system as proposed is scientifically designed and encompasses safety factors as well as ecological requirements in the disposal of waste materials;

Applicant by his testimony stated that, if required, he would supply an independent water system and sewage disposal plan, as well as adequate supervision to control, whenever required, ingress and egress of vehicles from and to Parker Avenue; that all lighting and signs would comply with the requisite Borough Ordinances and that operation would for the most part be confined to the day-light hours.

The Board further finds that the question raised by the adjoining property owners to the north relative to a pending application and the adjournment of this matter until said application is heard, is not deemed essential or requisite to it's proper determination of the present matter.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Adjustment that the application of David J. Laird and Robert F. Laird for a variance from the provisions of Article XI, Section 80 (4) from the requirements of the minimum side yard of 3 feet be denied and that the application for a permit pursuant to Article XI, Section 80 (1) for a use permit for the operation of the automatic car wash be and is hereby recommended to the Mayor and Council of Manasquan, subject to the following provisions and conditions:

1. That the water availability and sewage disposal

problems be referred to the Municipal Engineer for full determination and consideration by him relative to the possible installation of a separate Water system and Sewage disposal system; that if it be determined that the Municipal facilities are to be utilized, that proper fees be effectuated with respect to the use of each facility.

2. That the question as to the detergent to be used in connection with the operation of the car wash as to its biodegradable facets be also referred to the Municipal Engineer for evaluation and further determination as he deems necessary.

3. That the operation of the facility be restricted to hours between 8:00 A.M. and 8:00 P.M. and that an attendant be present at all times during the hours of operation.

4. That any restrictions relative to entering and exiting of vehicles to the subject premises be effectuated based upon the recommendations of the traffic division of the Municipal Police Department, either presently made, or those that could be made at a future date.

5. That proper signs be posted concerning the cautious operation of all motor vehicles as to entering and exiting the premises and further, prohibiting any vehicles to remain on premises after exiting the building housing the car wash operation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, and the Board does hereby determine that conditioned upon the operation of the car wash as outlined in the evidence presented, and upon conformance and compliance with the conditions and provisions as outlined above, that the granting of the use permit as to Lot 48, Block 52, will not be detrimental to the health, safety and general

welfare of the community, and that said operation is reasonably necessary for the convenience of the community.

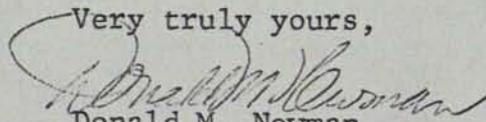
Gentlemen:

I have looked at the plans for the proposed car wash on Parker Avenue to be situated on Lot 48 in Block 52.

Mr. Laird, one of the principals, gave me information which indicates that the use of water would be 8-12 gallons per minute for a period of approximately one minute for each car washed. Of this water, approximately six gallons per car washed would be discharged to the Municipal sewer. This water use and sewage flow would not make any significant difference to the operation of the Borough's water and sewer systems.

I understand that the washwater containing the detergent will be almost entirely retained on the premises and will be trucked away by scavengers three to four times yearly. I suggest that the final plans be required to show a grit trap to remove grit from any water which is to be discharged to the Borough's sewer together with a vented grease and gasoline trap located outside the building.

Gentlemen:

On July 7, 1971 the hearing was conducted before the Board of Adjustment of the Borough of Manasquan concerning an application of Laird to construct and operate an automatic automobile cleaning station on property known as Lot 48 in Block 52 on the Tax Map. This property is 50 feet wide and located along the easterly side of Route 71.

In May of 1969, J. Clifford Lamb had made an application for construction of an automatic automobile cleaning station on Lots 51 and 52 in Block 52. This property is 100 feet wide along the easterly side of Route 71. At that time, the Board of Adjustment recommended the construction of the Lamb facilities to the Mayor and Council and the Mayor and Council approved the same. Due to financial problems, the station was not constructed and it was not until after the Laird application was submitted to the Board of Adjustment that Mr. Lamb discovered that his prior approval lapsed under the terms of the ordinance because more than one year had passed since the time of the approval.

Before the Laird application was heard, Mr. Lamb made his application to the Board of Adjustment for re-consideration of his project. At the hearing of the Laird matter, I brought this to the attention of the Board of Adjustment and suggested that no finding be made on either case until both cases were fully heard by the Board. The reason for this request was that the Laird project is to be constructed on a 50 foot lot and the Lamb project on a 100 foot lot.

The Board of Adjustment did not heed my request and made a recommendation to the Mayor and Council that the Laird application be approved. On the next week, the Board rejected the Lamb re-application because of the prior approval of the Laird matter. It would appear at this time that the sole inquiry is not whether the Laird application was approved first or whether Lamb had any prior rights because of his

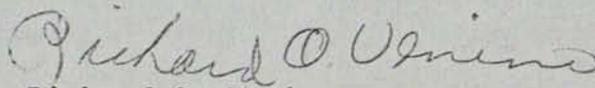

previous approval, but the single question is: What is best for the Borough of Manasquan? Since both stations are to be of equal quality and capability, it would appear that the Lamb project on a 100 foot lot would be far superior to the Laird station on a 50 foot lot.

I would request that the Mayor and Council would reject approving the Laird matter and send both the Laird and Lamb matters back to the Board of Adjustment for further consideration.

I would request that this letter be read at the Mayor and Council meeting to be held this evening. I will not be able to be in attendance because of a prior commitment as Chief of Sea Girt Fire Department.

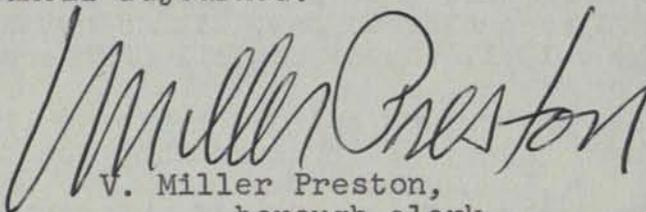

WHEREAS, it is in the public interest and need for the Borough of Manasquan to undertake to improve its housing and hotel inspection program in cooperation with the State of New Jersey in accordance with said law and Regulations; and

WHEREAS, The State of New Jersey has expressed a willingness to delegate to the Borough of Manasquan responsibilities for enforcing said law and Regulations and to make grant-in-aid assistance available in exchange therefore:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Governing Body of the Borough of Manasquan:

1. That as a matter of public policy the Borough of Manasquan wishes to participate in the State-Local Cooperative Housing Inspection Program to the greatest extent possible.

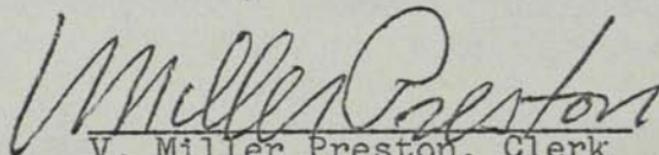

HIGHWAY LIGHTING REIMBURSEMENT AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, Made the Fifteenth day of December 19 71,

BETWEEN The Borough of Manasquan in the County of Monmouth, hereinafter called the "Municipality," party of the first part,

AND The STATE OF NEW JERSEY, acting through its Commissioner of Transportation hereinafter called the "State," party of the second part:

WHEREAS, traffic conditions exist at night along State Highway Route No. 71 at various locations within the said Municipality, which require lighting in order to minimize the danger of accidents after dark; and

WHEREAS, it is the purpose of this Agreement to aid said Municipality in an amount sufficient to reimburse it for a proportionate share of the net billing of the lighting units hereinafter specified, using the net billing rate as established by the lighting company hereinafter specified;

NOW, THEREFORE, this Agreement WITNESSETH that for and in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements contained herein it is agreed as follows:

1. The Municipality will negotiate agreement with the Utility Company to maintain and operate within the Municipality on State Highway Route No. 71 the following number of lighting units.

within said Municipality, and will pay all the electric bills for above designated highway lighting within said Municipality and will present to the State certified copies of receipted invoices of the Jersey Central Power & Light Company covering the net cost of said service.

2. The State will reimburse the Municipality in conformity with the Reimbursement Tabulation shown above, subject to contract and quantity discount and outage allowance granted by the Utility Company, for the actual number of hours during which the current has been used, which amount shall be paid to the Municipality in quarterly payments upon the presentation of receipted net invoices, for the term beginning the First day of January and ending the 31st day of December, 1972, provided the Legislature shall appropriate sufficient funds to the Department of Transportation for such purpose, after which time the State shall not be responsible for payment under this Agreement, except as hereinafter provided.

3. If traffic conditions continue to exist at night necessitating lighting as cited above, this Agreement may be extended from year to year, provided necessary funds are appropriated by the Legislature for the purpose, and provided the Municipality shall furnish the State on or before the 31st day of January of each year with duly certified copy of Resolution covering the extension of the Agreement for the ensuing year.

4. The State reserves the right to rescind this Agreement on giving to the Municipality thirty days' notice in writing of its intention to rescind, which notice shall be served upon the Clerk of said Municipality.

5. In the event that the rate as established by said lighting company should be reduced, the payments due from the State shall be reduced accordingly.

6. Lighting units and appurtenances subject to reimbursement under the terms of this Agreement shall be of the number and lamp size above specified and shall be of a type approved by the State; and the mast arm lengths, mounting heights, locations and all other details must conform to the requirements and standards established by the Department of Transportation.

7. The Municipality certifies that all things required by the law to be done and performed by it to enable it to carry out this Agreement have been duly done and performed.

Budget Is Adopted At Manasquan

MANASQUAN — The Council adopted a budget of \$883,973, down \$138,933, last night.

The Council acted after a public hearing on the water and sewer utility budget which was raised without objection by \$30,000 to \$259,402, to enable the Council to allocate funds for the removal of sludge.

The amount to be raised by taxes is \$551,680, up \$73,987.

Before the meeting, the Council met in closed session to consider informal bids for the removal of sludge. The Council will meet in open session tomorrow night, to receive bids formally.

A public hearing is scheduled for April 3, on a proposed ordinance setting a seasonal parking fee for lots on 2nd, 3rd, 4th and Pompano avenues. A season parking ticket from June 15 to Sept. 15 would cost \$6 for residents and \$8 for nonresidents.

A 50 cent fee would be charged for daily parking for nonseason ticket holders. The fee on weekends and holidays would be \$1.25.

The Council received a letter from Raymond C. Geiger, vice president of the National Business Corporation, which was recently denied a use permit on the former site of the Ferrous Die Casting Plant. The company intends to construct water metering devices.

Mr. Geiger wrote that its operation would use only electric melting furnaces and that no toxic fumes, gases, smoke or odors would be released. He also said that the company could comply with most of the recommendations on fire safety suggested by Leonard A. Mack, county fire marshal. He said they would not at first be able to build a fire door with link fuses between two buildings in the complex, because of the cost.

Mr. Geiger said his company was available for further discussion on these points and expressed the hope that legal action could be avoided.

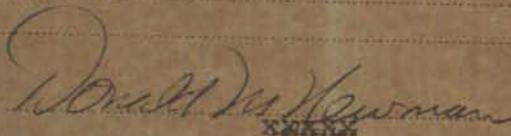

Manasquan Squad Plans Health Testing Program

MANASQUAN — The First Aid Squad will sponsor a health screening program May 20 open to all borough residents over 21.

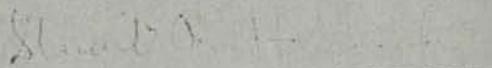

Dear Mr. Hancock:

In my letter of 3-11-71, I informed you that the Borough of Manasquan would be eligible for the sale of limited amounts of flood insurance at subsidized rates under the National Flood Insurance Program on and after 3-24-71. A rate study has now been completed for your area, and additional amounts of insurance at actuarial rates will be available effective May 12, 1972.

Enclosed are copies of the official flood insurance maps, the actuarial rate tables, and the flood insurance study for your community. The data contained in the flood insurance study will provide much of the technical information necessary to the development of a sound flood plain management program. Utilizing this data, your community will have to meet the requirements for land use and control measures contained in paragraph 1910.3(e) of our enclosed regulations within six months of 5-2-72, or by November 1972. The enclosed evaluation sheet as well as the appropriate ordinances should be submitted by that date.

FLOOD INSURANCE

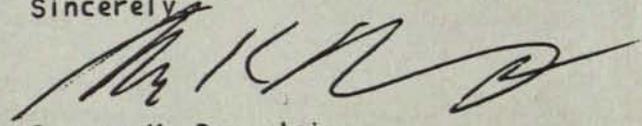
Now that additional coverage is available, owners of previously eligible structures may obtain a second layer of insurance at full actuarial (non-subsidized) rates. Owners of structures, the construction or substantial improvement of which started after 3-24-71, and which are located within the area having special flood hazards, may now obtain flood insurance coverage, but only at actuarial rates. However, new structures located outside the area of special flood hazard are eligible for coverage at chargeable rates.

In order for agents to write coverage on structures in areas of special flood hazard on or after the effective date of their identification, they must have information on lowest floor elevations for structures the construction or substantial improvement of which started after that date. Please advise us of the office or official designated to furnish the required information on lowest floor elevations.

The Office of the Borough Clerk, has been listed as the local repository where the enclosed flood insurance maps and rate tables will be made available for public inspection.

The National Flood Insurers Association has designated the Centennial Insurance Company, 97 Main Street, Chatham, New Jersey 07928, as its servicing agent to make the necessary insurance forms available to local agents and brokers. Property owners may obtain flood insurance from any licensed property or casualty insurance agent or broker in the area.
