

ASSEMBLY BILL 429

40:51-3. INSURANCE FOR DRIVERS OF PUBLICLY OWNED VEHICLES: MINIMUM. Every municipality shall cause to be insured the drivers of its motor cars, trucks and other vehicles, including the drivers of fire and police apparatus, and the drivers of such motor cars, trucks and other vehicles, including fire and police apparatus which shall be under the control of such municipality against liability for damages resulting in personal injury or death or damage to property caused by reason of the operation and use of such motor cars, trucks, vehicles and other apparatus.

Such insurance may be issued in the name of the municipality but it shall insure the authorized drivers of such motor cars, trucks and other vehicles against liability for damages to property, in any one accident, to an extent of not less than five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) and against liability for injuries or death of one person, in any one accident, to an extent of not less than fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000.00) and against liability for injuries or death of more than one person, in any one accident, to an extent of not less than one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00).

Every municipality which shall fail to provide insurance for the said drivers as provided in this section shall be liable for, and obligated to pay, any judgment recovered in a court of competent jurisdiction against any such driver within the limits of the amounts required above by way of insurance for damages resulting in personal injury or death, or damage to property, caused by reason of the authorized operation and use of such motor cars, trucks, vehicles and other apparatus. Whenever a claim or demand is made upon or an action is instituted against any such driver arising out of the operation and use of any vehicle or apparatus to which this section relates, he shall promptly give written notice thereof to the governing body of the municipality. The governing body may by resolution elect to intervene in the settlement of any such claim or demand or to defend any such action. Upon the adoption of such a resolution the municipality shall cause written notice thereof to be served upon the driver. A municipality shall not be liable for any judgment recovered against any such driver, notwithstanding its failure to insure as required by this section, if he shall fail or neglect to give the notice of any claim or demand as herein required, or shall fail to move promptly as a third-party plaintiff to name the municipality as a third-party defendant in any such action following service upon him of notice of the adoption of such resolution.





M., Monday to Friday inclusive, making the same stops on the return trip; train #4950 leaving Freehold at 7:12 A. M. arriving at Matawan at 7:39 A. M. on Saturday only and train #4957 leaving Matawan at 2:43 P. M. and arriving at Freehold at 3:09 P. M. on Saturday only; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee of the Township of Marlboro has been advised that a number of people regularly use these trains from Marlboro for commuting service to Matawan and points north thereof; and

WHEREAS, said trains have been in operation for a long number of years and are the only trains providing commuter railroad service from Marlboro; and the removal of these trains would further isolate the community; would result in inconvenience to customers of the railroad; and also have a detrimental influence upon the value of real estate in the township; and

WHEREAS, various citizens of the community have expressed their concern to the Township Committee and have

asked the Township Committee to take some action upon the matter and the Township Committee having considered the matter;

5. Freehold Branch - Matawan to Freehold

The Freehold Branch of the Central Railroad extends for a distance of 12.1 miles between Matawan and Freehold and serves intermediate stations at Freneau, Morganville, Wickatunk, Bradevelt, Marlboro, and East Freehold. Northbound service on this branch, Monday through Friday, is by Train #4902 which starts from Freehold at 6:46 A.M. The train serves the intermediate stations and arrives at Matawan at 7:13 A.M. After a 9 minute interval it proceeds to Jersey City where it arrives at 8:33 A.M. Southbound service, Monday through Friday, is provided by Train #4927 which leaves Matawan at 6:29 P.M. and arrives at Freehold at 6:56 P.M. The train serves the intermediate stations and the passengers travel from Jersey City to Matawan on Train #3327. Saturday service is provided by northbound Train #4950 which leaves Freehold at 7:12 A.M. and by southbound Train #4927 which leaves Matawan at 2:43 P.M. There is no service on Sunday.

The proposed schedule shows that the Applicant is to discontinue all rail passenger service on the Freehold Branch and substitute bus operation which will serve Freneau, Morganville, Wickatunk and Marlboro in addition to the terminal stations of Freehold and Matawan. The bus is scheduled to leave Freehold 4 minutes later than the present train in the morning and the evening bus is to arrive at Freehold at the same time as the present train. There will be no Saturday or Sunday service on the Freehold Branch.

Since the Monday through Friday trains carry approximately 30 passengers and the Saturday trains carry

about 8 passengers and as the population of the area around Freehold exceeds 10,000 persons, the Board is of the opinion that the demand for service is not sufficient to justify the operation of any passenger trains on the Freehold Branch of the Central Railroad.

The Board permits the substitution of buses for railroad passenger trains on the Freehold Branch provided that all local and State requirements provided by law are satisfied and the bus operation is approved by the Board before the change is placed in effect.

The 1952 Budget of the Township of Marlboro produces an estimated tax rate of \$8.98 per \$100.00 assessed valuation as compared with the tax rate of \$7.60 of 1951. A comparative analysis of the tax rates and tax levies of 1952 and 1951 is shown below:

You will note that of the total increase of 1.38 points the local purpose tax increase is only 4 points while the school increase is 1.32 points and the county increase is 2 points.

Operating appropriations have been kept at a minimum and the analysis above shows that the local purpose tax increase amounted to \$1,464.73 or 4.7 percent.

The Local School Tax shows an increase of \$26,510.68 or 132 points. The increase in the Local Purpose Tax can be attributed to the necessity of providing the Reserve for Uncollected Taxes for this increase.

The members of the Township Committee of the Township of Marlboro present the 1953 Budget with the following explanatory statement. The estimated tax rate for 1953 is \$9.33 as compared with the 1952 rate of \$9.00 or an increase of 33 points. This increase is detailed in the comparative analysis of the tax levies and rates as shown below:

The local purpose tax, the only portion of the Budget over which the Committee exercises any control, shows the same rate as in 1952. The 33 point increase is thus attributable to the local schools and the county which have independent administrative boards and must accept the responsibility for the increase. These rates are merely estimates and any change in the county or school levy shown here will directly change the \$9.33 estimated rate. The Committee has provided for increases in salary and wages appropriations of only \$1,800.00 and for increases in Other Expense appropriations of \$12,075.00. For the year 1953 the Committee has appropriated \$41,350.00 for work on streets and roads. These appropriations will provide for the repairs and maintenance of roads and also for the construction and reconstruction of roads. Your Committee feels that patchwork and temporary repairs are of no value unless this program is supplemented by a program of construction and reconstruction which will be more permanent and of more value. The financial position of the Township is sound and your Committee will continue to carry on operations as economically as possible so the taxpayers have the assurance that tax monies are put to the best available use.

You will note that of the total increase of 1.38 points the local purpose tax increase is only 4 points while the school increase is 132 points and the county increase is 2 points.
 Operating appropriations have been kept at a minimum and the analysis above shows that the local purpose tax increase amounted to \$1,464.73 or 4.7 percent.
 The Local School Tax shows an increase of \$26,510.68 or 132 points. The increase in the Local Purpose Tax can be attributed to the necessity of providing the Reserve for Uncollected Taxes for this increase.

The 1952 Budget of the Township of Marlboro produces an estimated tax rate of \$8.98 per \$100.00 assessed valuation as compared with the tax rate of \$7.60 of 1951. A comparative analysis of the tax rates and tax levies of 1952 and 1951 is shown below:

You will note that of the total increase of 1.38 points the local purpose tax increase is only 4 points while the school increase is 132 points and the county increase is 2 points.
 Operating appropriations have been kept at a minimum and the analysis above shows that the local purpose tax increase amounted to \$1,464.73 or 4.7 percent.
 The Local School Tax shows an increase of \$26,510.68 or 132 points. The increase in the Local Purpose Tax can be attributed to the necessity of providing the Reserve for Uncollected Taxes for this increase.
