

COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MARLBORO

REGULAR MEETING OF DECEMBER 30, 1970

Council President Brodniak called the meeting to order at 8:10 P.M. at Central School and introduced the Township officials seated at the Council table to the public. President Brodniak extended his best wishes for a happy, healthful New Year to the public and called for a moment of silence followed by the salute to our flag.

ROLL CALL: All Present.

Also present were Township Attorney James R. Minogue, Mayor Morton Salkind and Clerk Mildred Ackerman.

President Brodniak reviewed the agenda and noted there would be no reorganizational meeting on January 1, 1971 as there are no newly elected officials to be sworn in on January 1. He added appointments would be made this evening to become effective January 1, 1971.

President Brodniak said due to their busy schedule and work on the new zoning ordinance, Council would table action on the Rappa professional building until next meeting.

PUBLIC HEARING: Ordinance #22-70. AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING "AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE SALARIES OF THE OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MARLBORO (1970) "

Reprints of the ordinance were distributed to the public and a copy of same is attached hereto.

President Brodniak explained the ordinance to the public, noted Council had acted upon the recommendations of the Mayor, Business Administrator and Advisory Health Council.

Miss Edna Netter asked for an explanation of the duties of the Environmental Health Officer. The Mayor

**ORDINANCE #22-70  
AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND

as follows:

**SECTION 1.** Section 1 of the above en-  
titled ordinance is amended and sup-  
plemented as follows:

Division of Health, Registrar of Vital  
Statistics salary is changed to \$1,200.00  
per year retroactive to July 1, 1970.

The position of Road Foreman is here-  
by established at a salary of \$7,240.00  
per year.

The position of Environmental Officer  
is hereby established at the annual sal-  
ary of \$1,680.00 retroactive to Septem-  
ber 7, 1970.

**SECTION 2.** This ordinance shall take  
effect twenty days after its final pas-  
sage by Council and approval by the  
Mayor.

replied and introduced Mr. A. W. Meyer (The Environmental Health Officer), who explained his duties. Mr. John Narzowich said he was not opposed to the ordinance but questioned its retroactive provisions. He felt adequate provisions should have been made in advance, in both the salary ordinance and budget.

As no one else wished to speak on the ordinance, at 8:45 P.M. the Chair called for a motion to close the public hearing. So moved by Councilman Grossman, seconded by Councilman Williams and carried unanimously on a roll call vote.

Councilman Czerny offered the following resolution and urged its adoption:

RESOLUTION #284-70

"BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Township of Marlboro that an Ordinance entitled:

Ordinance #22-70

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING "AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE SALARIES OF THE OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MARLBORO (1970)"

be adopted on second and final reading and notice of the passage thereof shall be advertised according to law.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that it is hereby declared to be an emergency and therefore the above ordinance shall take effect immediately upon approval by the Mayor and publication thereof."

Seconded by Councilman McLaughlin and adopted unanimously on a roll call vote.

The Mayor signed the ordinance and announced Mr. Meyer's appointment as Environmental Health Officer as of September 10, 1970.

ACCEPTANCE OF BIDS: Lot 10, Block 26-B, Wilson Avenue

The Clerk read the Notice of Public Sale which had been published on December 11, 1970 and December 18, 1970 in

The Asbury Park Press.

Council President Brodniak asked the Clerk if any bids had been received. The Clerk replied no bids had been received by her office.

President Brodniak opened the bidding to the public.

Mr. Stephen Rappa, 5 Union Ave., Morganville bid \$3500.00.

Mr. Pennetti, Route 79, Morganville bid \$3600.00.

Mr. Stephen Rappa then bid \$4000.00.

The Chair called for additional bids. There were none. The Chair then called for a motion that bidding on Lot 10, Block 26B be brought to a close. So moved by Councilman McLaughlin, seconded by Councilman Grossman and carried unanimously on a roll call vote. The Chair then called a recess to discuss the results of the bidding.

The meeting was called to order at 9:10 P.M. Councilman Grossman moved that Stephen Rappa's bid of \$4000.00 for Lot 10 Block 26B be accepted by Council according to the terms of the Notice of Public Sale.

Seconded by Councilman Czerny.

DISCUSSION: President Brodniak noted that one of the reasons this piece of property was offered for sale was to enable an adjoining property owner to buy same, as this owner had applied to the Board of Adjustment for a variance due to insufficient lot size. He noted the adjoining home owner had not offered a bid and he instructed Mr. Minogue to contact the Board of Adjustment to state that Council felt the application for a variance should be denied as no offer to buy the property was received and the applicant had therefore forfeited their right to build on an undersized lot. The motion to accept Mr. Rappa's bid was thereafter carried unanimously on a roll call vote.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS: Councilman McLaughlin offered the following resolution and urged its adoption:

"WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:4-55.1, the Township of Marlboro adopted Ordinance #10-1969, appropriating \$100,000.00 for the purpose of repairing and reconstructing portions of certain roads within the Township damaged by snow, ice and frost; and

WHEREAS, it has been recommended by the Township Engineer that the repair of Wilson Avenue authorized in said Ordinance be cancelled by reason of the impending installation of water service lines by the Municipal Utilities Authority in the bed of Wilson Avenue; and

WHEREAS, the Township Engineer has advised that the cancellation of the repair of Wilson Avenue and other savings realized by reason of lower contract prices will result in an unexpended balance of \$25,000.00 under said appropriation:

NOW, THEREFORE, <sup>BE</sup> IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Township of Marlboro that the sum of \$25,000.00 be and the same is hereby cancelled from the appropriation heretofore made under Ordinance #10-1969, adopted June 12, 1969, appropriating \$100,000.00 for the purpose of repairing and reconstructing certain roads damaged by snow, ice and frost; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this Resolution be transmitted by the Township Clerk to the Division of Local Finance of the State of New Jersey."

Seconded by Councilman Williams and adopted unanimously on a roll call vote.

Councilman Williams offered the following Resolution and urged its adoption:

RESOLUTION #286-70

"WHEREAS, the Council of the Township of Marlboro on December 4, 1970 finally passed an ordinance entitled:

Ordinance #20-70

"AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING THE ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF MARLBORO"

and;

WHEREAS, thereafter the above entitled ordinance was submitted to the Mayor; and

WHEREAS, within ten (10) days after receiving said ordinance, the Mayor returned the same with a statement setting forth his objections thereto;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Township of Marlboro (at least 4 members voting affirmatively) that the veto of the above entitled ordinance by the Mayor be overridden."

Seconded by Councilman McLaughlin.

DISCUSSION: Councilman Grossman objected to the ordinance and said he did not think it practical, that it should wait until after the disposition of the pending zoning suits and that it was non-essential.

Councilman McLaughlin noted the position of Zoning Officer and Building Inspector was intended to be one and the same, as set forth in the salary ordinance approved by the Mayor earlier in the year. He said the ordinance was in accordance with a resolution received from the Board of Adjustment as it required the Building Inspector-Zoning Officer to attend Zoning Board of Adjustment meetings for which he was being paid.

Mrs. Czerny pointed out Council's main duty was to the taxpayer and that the Building Inspector could safely carry out both duties without any burden in view of the amount of construction in town.

The Mayor spoke of Mr. Savoie's Civil Service appointment as Building Inspector and said we needed another person to carry out Zoning Officer's duties in order to have proper zoning enforcement. He questioned Mr. Minogue as to Mr. Savoie's possible status as department head under our Administrative Code. He said he had instructed Mr. Savoie to carry out this ordinance if it is adopted over his veto.

Council President pointed out that it is the Mayor's duty to enforce the Ordinances. He added, some day the Building Inspector would be very busy and the town would have need of a separate zoning department, but it was not busy right now and would not be busy for a long time, that

under Civil Service we can not cut a salary and this ordinance would provide Mr. Savoie with sufficient work to cover the salary he has been receiving.

Nolan, Supervising Engineer of the Traffic Bureau in the Department of Transportation of the State of New Jersey, recommending the establishment of a 35 mile per hour speed zone on Greenwood Road in Marlboro Township from Tennent Road to the vicinity of Wicker Place and thence 40 miles per hour on Greenwood Road to the Madison Township line;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Traffic Bureau of the Department of Transportation with a request that specifications for the installation of signs be determined.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to the Clerk of the Township of Madison, Middlesex County."

Seconded by Councilman McLaughlin and adopted unanimously on a roll call vote.

NEW BUSINESS:

Councilman Czerny offered the following Resolution and urged its adoption:

be introduced and passed first reading and that the same be published in The Asbury Park Press on 1/9/71 with the notice required by law and that the same be considered for final passage on 1/21/71 at 8 P.M. at Central School, Marlboro Township, at which time all persons interested will be given an opportunity to be heard concerning said ordinance.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said ordinance be referred to the Planning Board for its report according to statute."

Seconded by Councilman Williams.

Councilman McLaughlin explained the various land uses in the Zoning Map, noted differences between the Master Plan and Zoning Map and cited some highlights of the Zoning Ordinance. He pointed out Council is very anxious to hear and consider what the people have to say about the ordinance and map especially so since the OR concept is new to Marlboro. President Brodniak stressed the ordinance and map was not final and that Council intends to fully consider the wishes of the people as set forth at the public hearing.

The Ordinance was adopted unanimously on a roll call vote.

Councilman Czerny offered the following resolution and urged its adoption:

RESOLUTION #297-70

"BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Township of Marlboro that James R. Minogue, Counselor at Law, is

hereby appointed municipal attorney of the Township of Marlboro for a term of one year commencing January 1, 1971, and until his successor is appointed and qualified, and he is to be paid a reasonable fee for services rendered."

Seconded by Councilman Williams.

DISCUSSION: Mayor Salkind read a prepared statement setting forth his objection to the appointment of the Township Attorney and by later action Township Engineer which he claims is contrary to the pertinent provisions of the Faulkner Act, and reserving his right as elected mayor to contest these appointments.

Council President Brodniak said the present Administrative Code was legal and termed the Mayor's statement another attempt to gather more power for himself.

The resolution was adopted on the following roll call vote:

Councilman McLaughlin offered the following resolution and urged its adoption:

Avakian is hereby appointed as Municipal Engineer for the Township of Marlboro for a term of one year commencing January 1, 1971, and until his successor is appointed and qualified and that the salary to be paid to such official shall be at the same rate of salary as may be fixed by ordinance and, in addition thereto, he is to receive such fees as may be properly payable to him pursuant to General and Local Law."

Seconded by Councilman Williams.

DISCUSSION: Councilman/<sup>Grossman</sup>complimented Mr. Avakian on his capable work but questioned whether the Township could save money by having its own full time engineering department. The Mayor said he had instructed Mr. Hartnett to make a cost survey and report his findings directly to Council.

The resolution was adopted thereafter on a roll call vote.
